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LEARNING OUTCOMES:

- 1) Students will understand general employment law principles and specific rules governing common employment law situations.
- 2) Students will be able to successfully identify employment law issues and translate complex employment law concepts into easy-to-understand information for unsophisticated clients.
- 3) Students will have the skill to conduct a productive client interview, including knowing when to listen and when to ask questions.
- 4) Students will know how to describe an employment law intake, and propose a specific solution for that intake, to supervising attorneys, mentors, law firm partners and/or co-counsel.
- 5) Students will have the compassion and professionalism needed to understand and relate to clients from diverse backgrounds and cultures.

On assigned Thursdays, you will report to Clinic via Zoom at 5:30 p.m. (with the exception of Clinic orientation, which will start at 4:00 p.m., see below). You will attend a presentation from 5:30 to 6:15 p.m. on selected employment law topics that are relevant to Clinic counseling.
